Waste Collection Overview

If you live in Woodstock, there are a number of ways that you can “get rid” of stuff you no longer need. Options include:

Curbside Garbage Collection



The City of Woodstock offers weekly curbside garbage collection to homes throughout the city. The city is divided into different zones that determine your collection day. You can find out what zone you live in by looking at the map on the back cover of this guide. You can also find collection information based on your address using the Wasteline App. You can find the app online at www.cityofwoodstock.ca/waste or for download from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store. Find more information about what goes in your curbside garbage collection on page 3.

Curbside Recycling Collection



The City also offers bi-weekly curbside recycling collection to Woodstock homes. That means, every other week you can place acceptable recyclable materials out with your garbage collection. Recycling must be sorted into two separate bins: one for cardboard and paper (sometimes referred to as “Fibres”) and one for containers (these are typically cans and jars made of plastic, glass or metal). Because recycling is collected bi-weekly, in addition to knowing your zone, check the map on the back cover to see if your recycling will be collected during Week A or Week B. EnviroDepot



For your convenience, the City of Woodstock also operates the EnviroDepot, located at 944 James St. Woodstock residents can use the EnviroDepot to drop off large items, household hazardous waste and recyclable materials that

aren’t collected through curbside recycling. There is no charge for dropping off most items as this is a tax-based service, however, there is a \$10 disposal fee for items containing freon (fridges, freezers, air conditioners). Oxford County residents who do not live in Woodstock are still able to use the EnviroDepot but fees will apply. See beside for more information about the EnviroDepot.

Yard Waste Depot



To help residents with outdoor yard clean up, the City also operates a Yard Waste Depot at 944 James St. Yard waste, brush and woodchips are collected into three piles within the depot which are then used for compost or turned into woodchips. Residents are encouraged to drop off loose materials into the three piles and plastic bags are not allowed.

Backyard Compost



Composting is an easy way to reduce household garbage by turning organic materials into valuable resources for your lawn or garden. There are several types of backyard composters available and you can buy black yard waste and green cone composters at the Public Works/Engineering building at 944 James St. Find more information on page 3.

Salford Waste Management Facility

Oxford County’s Waste Management Facility is a one-stop shop for residents and businesses in Oxford County to dispose of their garbage and recycling. Located at 384060 Salford Rd., Salford, the landfill is open to Oxford County residents and tipping fees apply. Learn more at www.oxfordcounty.ca/waste

WHAT IS THE ENVIRODEPOT?

The EnviroDepot is a convenient service offered to Woodstock residents to help them get rid of items that cannot be collected as part of their curbside garbage and recycling collection. You can drop off large items, household hazardous waste and recyclable materials like Styrofoam or large (flattened) cardboard that aren’t collected through curbside recycling. **Absolutely no household garbage is accepted at this site.**

HOURS

The EnviroDepot is open:

- Wednesday – Friday* 10 a.m. – 6 p.m.
- Saturday 7:30 a.m. – 3 p.m.

*Please note: From Dec. 1 – March 31, the EnviroDepot is only open to accept recyclable materials from Wednesday to Friday. Large items, household hazardous waste and construction materials are only accepted on Saturdays during the winter.

WHAT’S ACCEPTED

Recycling

- Containers
- Paper and Cardboard
- EPS Foam packaging (e.g. Styrofoam)
- **Note:** packing peanuts, pool noodles, meat trays, foam takeout containers, polyethylene / polypropylene foam are not recyclable and must be placed in your garbage.

There is no charge for dropping off most items as this is a tax-based service, however, there is a \$10 disposal fee for items containing freon (fridges, freezers, air conditioners). Oxford County residents who do not live in Woodstock are still able to use the EnviroDepot but fees will apply.

Information about Curbside Garbage Collection

What goes in the garbage?



Single use plastics (straws, plastic cutlery, plastic bags)



Household items (hangers, disposable mop sheets, dryer sheets)



Personal care items (diapers, sanitary products, bandages)



Food wrap (chip and cookie bags, cereal liners, wrappers, wax paper)



Food waste (if compost not available)



Specialty paper (laminated material, notebook covers, gift wrap, ribbons, photographs, stickers / labels)



Pens, markers, highlighters



Pet waste



Styrofoam food packaging and coffee / beverage cups

Bag tags

Oxford County uses bag tags for curbside garbage collection. Tags cost \$2 each and help offset the total cost of the curbside collection program by charging more for those who use the program more and rewarding those who throw out less. Garbage bags smaller than 76 × 96 cm (30 × 38 in) need one tag, larger bags need two tags and if you have a “Herbie Curbie” garbage cart, it requires three tags. The maximum weight for any sized bag is 20 kg (44 lbs).



Wasteline App

Not sure where something goes? The Wasteline app will help identify what items should be placed out for household garbage, recycling, special collection or taken out to the County landfill.

- Harvest rainwater - Collect rainwater in a rain barrel to help manage stormwater runoff and reduce water bills when watering your garden.

Garbage and Recycling Collection

Curbside Brush Collection

Collected April 3–6. Brush must be at the curb by 7 a.m. Monday. Brush and limbs must be tied in bundles, less than 2 metres or 6 feet long and weigh less than 23 kg or 50 lbs. Roots and dirt must be removed.

Large Item Collection

April 17–May 19. Your collection week is based on your normal garbage collection day. Refer to the map on the back cover to determine your Zone/Day. Max 5 items. Must be placed at the curb by 7 a.m. Monday of your collection week. Questions? Call 519-539-2382 x3104 or x3102.

A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire.



Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.



If the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.



Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement. Larger homes may need more alarms. For the best protection, make sure all smoke alarms are interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.




















Call 911 from a cellphone or a neighbour's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.

Curbside Brush Collection

Collected October 2–6. Brush must be at the curb by 7 a.m. Monday. Brush and limbs must be tied in bundles, less than 2 metres or 6 feet long and weigh less than 23 kg or 50 lbs. Roots and dirt must be removed.

Curbside Leaf Collection Begins

For residents who aren't able to compost leaves on their property or drop them off at the Yard Waste Depot, the City offers curbside leaf collection from Oct. 16 – Nov. 30. Staff will rotate through 9 zones for the length of the program to collect leaves raked and piled to the curb.

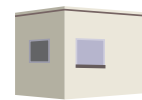

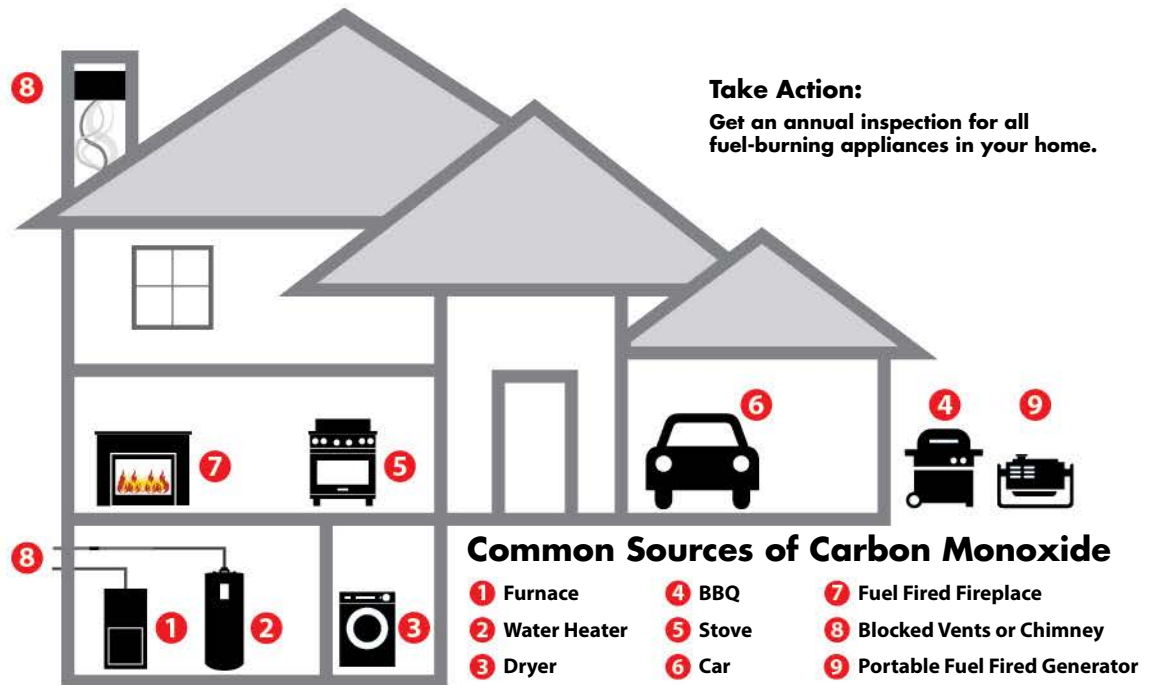
Things To Know About Carbon Monoxide (CO)

Bag Tag Requirements



Bag Tags must be stuck on the top half of the garbage bag. Both ends of the tag must be visible. If using a container, place the tag on top of the material inside.

One Bag Tag is needed for:

- Each bag, maximum size 76×96 cm and maximum weight of 20 kg.
- Each container less than 128 L in size.

Two Bag Tags needed for:

- Large-sized bags, larger than 76×96 cm.
- Each rigid container between 129–240 L. Container must be in good repair.
